I'm sure the trans people you know are upset. Their rights movement has told them that any women who won't comply hates

They are actively exacerbating the distress of a vulnerable population for political leverage. And once again who gets blamed? Like we get blamed for men murdering trans women. The solution to conflict is mutual recognition. I recognise that

What they are actually demanding is complete and total access with no oversight to all female spaces and to cast any female objections as evil and discriminatory. That is not a reasonable place to start from. And we

Then we can start working out how to get out of this mess. But dismissing or dodging the issue won't get us there.

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
